Associate of Arts Degree Family Support Studies Washington State University Department of Human Development Program Requirements 2011-2012

Program Description Family Support Studies is a unique program which has received national recognition. Course work provides education and training to students currently working or desiring to work with individuals and their families using Family Support practice and principles. This **98 credit** Associate of Arts degree is designed for students who plan to transfer to the Washington State University's (WSU) Human Development program. With this AA degree and all admission requirements, students will qualify for junior standing on acceptance into the program. WSU offers a Bachelor of Arts in Human Development on the Pullman and Vancouver campuses and through WSU Online. With this articulation, it is possible for students to earn a 4-year degree in Human Development that recognizes the Family Support Studies courses as a minor concentration through access to Edmonds Community College and Distance Degree Programs.

Admission Requirement to Washington State University's Human Development Program All students who intend to transfer to WSU should talk with a University adviser to review specific admission requirements. Students must have a 2.5 minimum cumulative grade point average to be considered for admission to WSU. EdCC Requirements This AA Degree requires successful completion of **98 credits** as outlined. A minimum of 30 credits or one-third of the required credits, whichever is less, must be earned at Edmonds Community College. Students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in all college-level courses.

Intermediate Algebra Proficiency This requirement may be satisfied by completion of high school mathematics through second year algebra, completion of MATH 090, the sequence MATH 091 and MATH 092 or MATH 095.

Cultural Diversity Students pursuing an AA degree must meet the 5-credit Cultural Diversity requirement by completing courses marked as “:CD” on the requirement sheet and/or “Meets Cultural Diversity Requirement” in the quarterly class schedule. Those courses may also be used to fulfill other requirements of the degree.

Students are Advised to

- Plan their schedule several quarters in advance in order to accommodate courses that are offered only once or twice a year
- Review the college catalog for required course prerequisites and include these in schedule planning
- Communicate with a faculty adviser
If transferring to a four-year institution, the student should consult with the appropriate department at the intended transferring school for entrance requirements. For more information or to schedule an advising appointment call 425-640-1458
- Send for transcripts from other colleges where the student has earned credits and request a transcript evaluation. Transcripts are to be mailed to the Enrollment Services Office at Edmonds Community College. Transcript evaluation forms are available through Enrollment Services

Quantitative or Symbolic Reasoning

- Students must complete either a quantitative reasoning course (MATH &107, 140, &141, &142, &146, &148, &151, CS&115, &131; CHEM 141; or PHYS &121, &221; SOC 200) OR a symbolic reasoning course (PHIL& 106). WSU recommends MATH& 107, &146 or PHIL& 106.

Distribution Requirements

- Students must select from at least three (3) departments/disciplines within this distribution area. WSU recommends PSYC& 100 and SOC& 101 under C.
- A maximum of five (5) credits in Performance/Skills courses may be applied to the Humanities distribution requirement. (Performance/Skill courses are listed under Humanities on the Distribution Requirements List)
- A maximum of five (5) credits in foreign language at the 100 level may be applied to the Humanities distribution requirement.
- Students must select from at least two (2) departments/disciplines within this distribution area.

At least ten (10) credits of Natural Science classes are required, five of which must be a laboratory science. The laboratory courses are underlined in the Natural Sciences and Mathematics distribution list. (Computer Science, Mathematics, and Philosophy classes are **not** Natural Science classes.) WSU recommends NUTR& 101.
